# **INSTRUCTIONS RENTAL BICYCLE**

Thanks for the trust you place in bicigrino.com and especially in me.

Please try greasing (slightly) at least once a day the bike (chain and change), when you do be sure to have a paper or something to remove excess grease from the chain, if you put grease on the chain with mud or dust it is counterproductive.

If you find the bicycle dismantled for transportation, remember that there is a multitool with the bike that lets you easily assemble, you just have to put in place the pedals (remember that left is marked with an 'L' and the right with a "R", adjust the seat and handlebars and tighten.



\*more or less how you find the bike in the box.



\*\* The pedals may be secured with cable ties to prevent loss during transport or in the saddlebags.



\*\*Be sure the pedal labeled "R goes on the right and pedal marked with "L" goes on the left side. In the hotel or hostel you'll find a wrench 15 that lets you tighten. (remember the pedals tighten or screw opposite of what you are accustomed to threading.



\*\* You will find the handlebars rotated lengthwise when you remove the bike from the packing box.



\*\* Turn the handlebars and place it in the correct position to ride, tighten the two small screws on the side with the Allen key on the multitool.

With these two basic and easy operations, settings the handlebar and placing the pedals, the bike is assembled and ready to leave for the road.

The saddlebags have a unique locking system and are waterproof. It is very important that the saddlebags do not shift so mount carefully. To mount on the bike start with the two upper end clips, secure from the outside inwards (towards bicycle) and then tighten down and secure the clips. In the following video you will see how they are mounted and locked.

 $\ensuremath{^{**}}$  Once attached and locked the saddle bags should remain locked. To avoid problems with the rack fasteners (especially on the bottom) every day before you leave be sure to tighten the screws a little because the "rattle" of cycling tends to loosen and if the screw is loosened it can damage the screw stay on the bike ... so it is important as a precaution every day to check the tightness of these screws holding the rack.
